In May 2011, the first cohort of IBDP students completed the program successfully and has subsequently continued to progress and go from strength to strength.



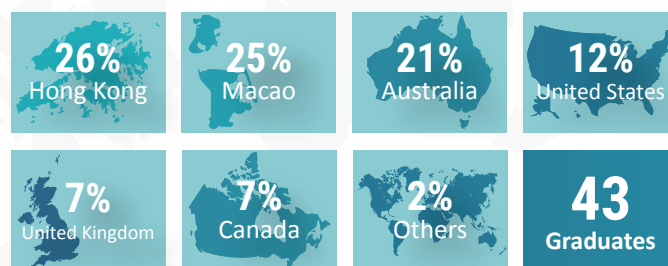
CERTIFICATES

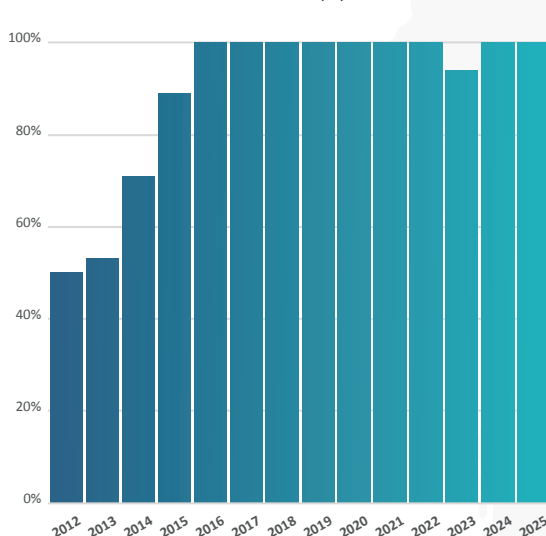

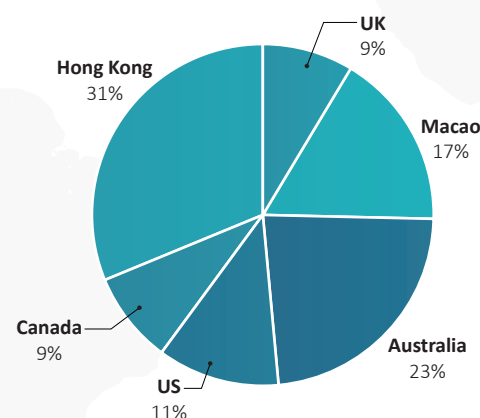

2025 IBDP UNIVERSITY DESTINATION



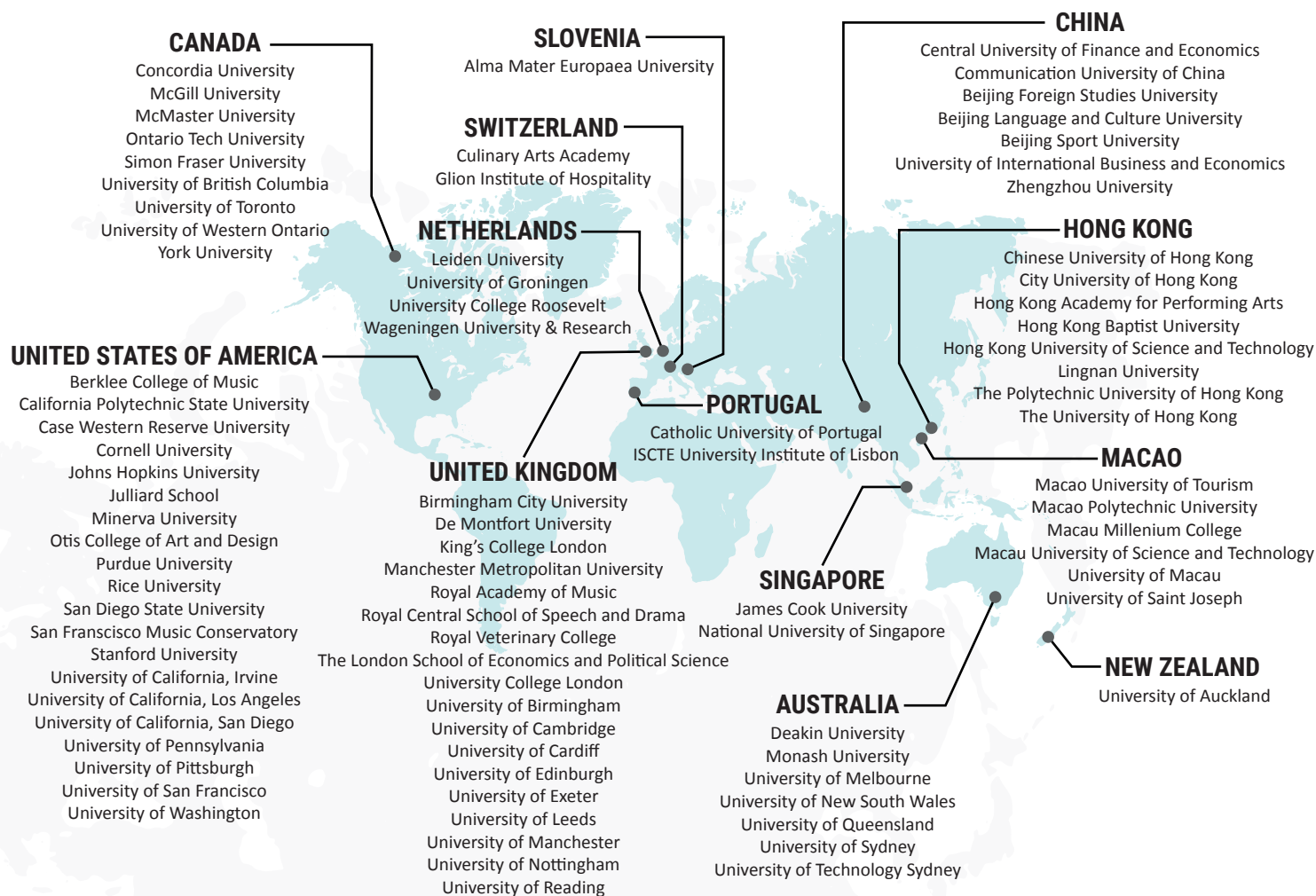
